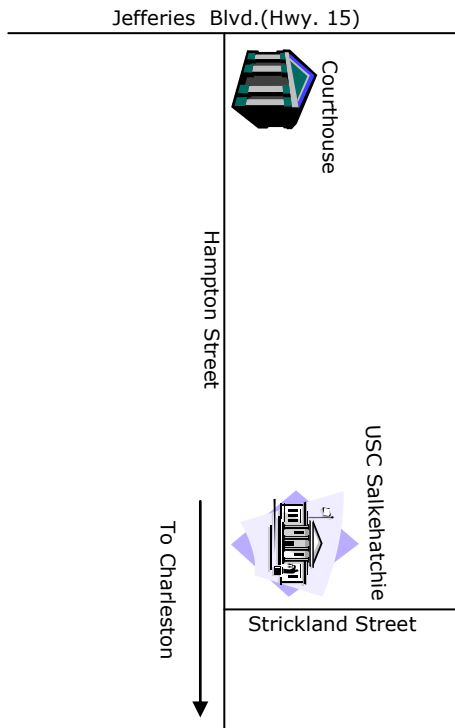

## Keynote Presentation: Rediscovering the Rice Kitchen



Glenn Roberts, Anson Mills

Anson Mills specializes in grits and other "historic" grains, including buckwheat, polenta, cornmeal, flours and rice, grown from antique and heirloom seeds. These seeds have been gathered from farms where families have grown a specific variety for generations. Many of the grains were on the verge of extinction, and Anson Mills has been responsible for preserving their seed and reintroducing their flavor to the kitchen.
